1 'A' LEVEL OR BTEC COMPUTING

Key features of sixth form contract:

- All students required to study in Sixth Form Area during morning non-lesson time – silent study
- BTEC Health and Social Care (Double), and Business students, will be given a pass to work on computers upstairs – remote supervision
- Students expected to check school emails and Sixth Form screen on a daily basis

Key features of sixth form contract:

- Parents/Carers encouraged to register for 'parentmail'
- Recommendations re: paid work no more than 12 hours
- Folders with dividers required to help with organisation in each subject area
- Students' place in the Sixth Form is for one year only in the first instance – with guaranteed progression into Year 13 subject to internal examination results and BTEC external examination results in line with expected grades, at least 90% attendance at lessons in all subject areas and satisfactory attitudinal references.

 Library materials and reference books are available for use during Sixth Form study. Support available from Mrs Hawkins in the library. Training with regards to what is available for Sixth Form students in terms of journals etc. took place on Tuesday 5 September.

- WIFI is available in Sixth Form if students want to bring in their own tablets/laptops – school user name and password will access WIFI.
- Secure lockers available in Sixth Form for storing equipment – see Mrs Donovan for keys

- Sixth Form Tab on school portal detailing independent study material in each subject area
- Support identified and put in place through tutorials – revision skills, time management etc.
- Study Skills a focus of extended tutor sessions

One-to-one and small group tutorials.

Attendance essential – research has shown that this is one of the most effective ways of securing high achievement.

When students know who their one-to-one tutor is, (usually their form tutor), they can ask for a tutorial if they feel it appropriate.

Tracking student progress:

- Tutorials
- Data input required 3 times a year for students in Year 12 (calendar in the Guide)
- December and June mock exams for all.
 - (Minimum expected grades will be provided to students over the next few weeks based on GCSE average point score.)
- Use of academic management system (in post-results pack)

Support:

Students able to access support from tutors and other staff within school. These needs may be identified at tutorials:

- Self-esteem
- Stress management
- Team Work including problem-solving and decision-making
- Study skills including:
 - understanding and developing memory
 - retention and revision
 - time management and note-taking
