DIFFERENCE BETWEEN

BTEC/Cambridge National vs GCSE



BTEC/Cambridge National

Vocational courses

- More coursework than GCSEs
- Includes some written examinations
- Assessment across the 2 years



GCSE

Academic Courses

- More written exams than practical work work
- Assessment mainly at the end of 2 years
- Some (e.g., Art & Design) involve more coursework

 This will be covered in detail in the next careers hour.

Do Choose A Course vs Don't Choose A Course

✓ Do Choose A Course Because:

- You enjoy the subject and are curious to learn more
- It matches your strengths and interests
- It supports your future goals or keeps options open
- You've researched the content and assessment style
- Teacher feedback suggests it's a good fit

✗ Don't Choose A Course Because:

- Your friends are choosing it
- You think it will be easy
- You like the teacher this year
- Someone else decided for you
- It helps avoid another subject rather than choose well

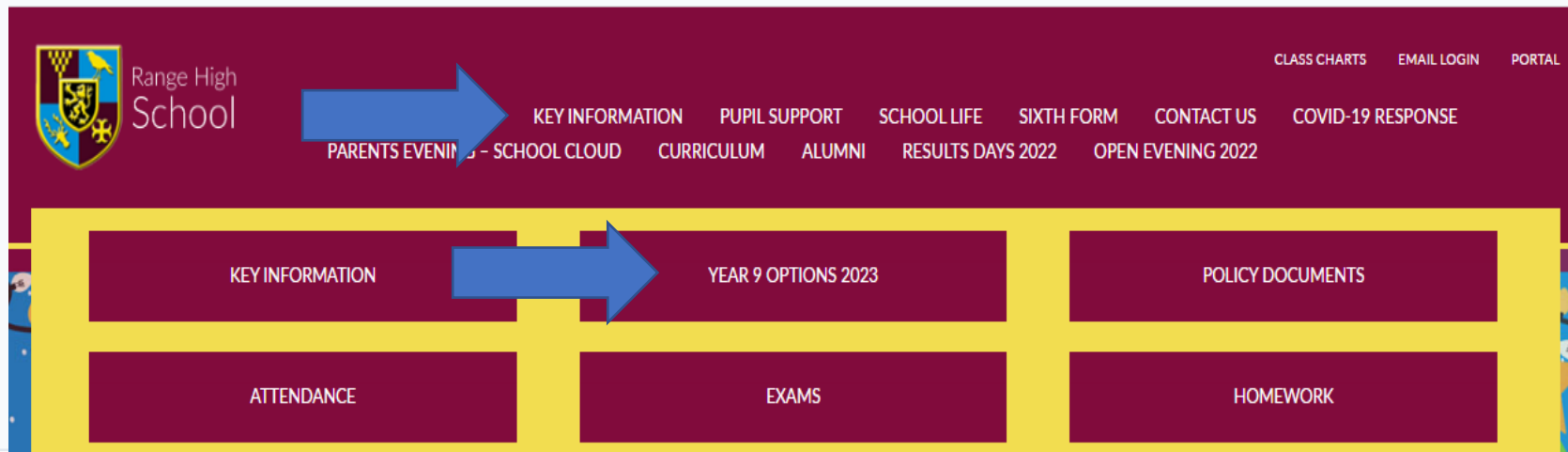
